WASTE WISE

Following on from our waste reduction initiatives of waste free lunches introduced in 2017 and paper recycling that has been in place for some time, we have a few new ideas to put in place this year. Our aim is to reduce the amount of waste our school is producing and to recycle or reuse as much of the waste as possible.

The teachers collected all the plastic wrapping and packaging from your children's booklist items and these were then delivered to Coles where they have a collection point for soft plastics.

On Fridays we have 'Food Scraps Friday'. The wonderful Mrs Savage has offered her time each Friday lunch time to come in and collect any food scraps left over from your children's lunchboxes. She then takes these food scraps home to her compost.

Tuesdays and Thursdays are our official 'Waste Free Days' where we encourage families and children to pack lunchboxes with little or no waste in them. It's great to see so many students with bento style lunchboxes and reusable containers. Lots of children are waste free every day ②. Some students have told us that they open the package and throw it in the bin at home so that their lunchbox doesn't have any waste②. Maybe mum and dad could try to purchase things in larger packages and then place it in a small reusable container each day rather than buying small snack packs for lunchboxes. Small changes can make a huge difference to our environment.

Mrs Griffiths is all collecting coffee pods for an activity so please feel free to bring your used coffee pods to Year 3 as a reusing initiative and Mrs Hughes is collecting 'artwork' series disposable coffee cups.

In 2018 we formed a committee of interested parents and teachers to drive some wastewise initiatives for our school. Stink bug alert!


The Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development is asking Fremantle residents and businesses to look out for a serious pest not usually found in Australia, called Brown marmorated stink bug (BMSB).

A live bug was found last month at the Fremantle Port. This pest often stowaways in cargo imported from Europe and the United States. The department reports that BMSB causes major damage to fruit and vegetable crops and ornamental plants, and over winter looks for shelter in homes, sometimes in their thousands. Not a bug we want in WA!

BMSB looks like some native Australian stink bugs but is larger (12-17mm) and has distinctive black and white banding around the outer edge of the abdomen. The department has made available flyers showing a cheap and easy way to make BMSB traps, to get students looking in their gardens and homes. They are available from the front office.

How can you find out if you have Brown marmorated stink bug on your property?

Make a trap to join the bug hunt!

A home-made trap is an easy and cost effective way of finding out if there are any Brown marmorated stink bugs on your property. Making a trap is fast and simple. This trap uses light as a lure for the bugs.

The Brown marmorated stink bug (BMSB) is an invasive pest that can cause serious damage to agricultural crops and ornamental plants including sweet corn, tree nuts and fruits such as apples, peaches, figs, mulberries, citrus, grapes, strawberries and persimmons.


BMSB is also a nuisance pest, as it seeks shelter in large numbers in buildings and equipment, and has a foul smelling odour when disturbed.

We need to look out for this pest because it is occasionally found in shipments coming into Australia. If we find them early, we can stop potential spread of BMSB. Please report.

What you need

- · empty soft drink bottle (straight sides)
- · masking tape
- · electrical tape
- · sharp cutting blade
- · marker pen
- · battery operated cavity light





Instructions

Step 1

Draw a line around the top third of the bottle and cut along the line, cutting away from fingers. Turn the bottle as you go, rather than turning the cutting tool.

Step 2

Cover the base of the bottle with black electrical tape. This will maximise the attracting effect of the light.

Step 3

Place the light inside the bottle.



Put the freshly removed top portion of the bottle upside down into the bottom portion. This will create a funnel so bugs can get in, but can't get out.



Step 5

Place four strips of masking tape along the side of the bottle, to create a 'bug ladder'. This will also hold the funnel in place.



Step 6

Use a long object to click on the light. Remove after use.

Place the trap in a room or building at night or in a dark spot around your home.

What happens if you find something?

- 1. Freeze the bug inside the trap (at least 5 minutes)
- 2. Remove the bug from the trap to take a photo
- 3. Place the bug back in the trap
