

Hello happy campers,

Congratulations to those who have signed up for the Dads & Kids (and Carers!) Camp at East Fremantle Primary School. The idea of the camp is to build stronger connections between kids and their dads/carers, as well as to build friendships between all the awesome dads/carers that we have in the school community. Some important information:

Emergency contact and First Aid Officer: Our First Aid Officer and emergency contact at the camp is Dr Andrew Walker. Andrew's mobile number is 0433 292 503.

Waste management: In an effort to minimise waste, please remember to bring your reusable coffee cup and cups for the kids' beverages (juice and/or Milo) at breakfast. Also, if you are ordering pizzas for dinner, please put the empty pizza boxes (and other bulky items of rubbish) in the big bin near the maintenance shed – don't put them in the regular bins or they will quickly overflow.



Get your kids excited about the camp. *Tell them how much you are looking forward to camping with them*. Pull out the tent, sleeping mats, sleeping bags, an old fry pan, some plastic cups, plates and cutlery, change the batteries in the torches, and grab a camping chair.

Talk to your kids about what you should make together for tea on the Friday night. Please BYO stove. Then go shopping with the kids to buy the items and a few munchies for the tent. All Dads & Kids will supply & cook dinner together Friday night. A cooked breakfast is provided on Saturday morning.

Rock up to the school oval at <u>5pm Friday 6th March</u>. Knock-off early that day to make sure you can park the car (or the wheel barrow) with the kids. <u>There will be no vehicles allowed in the school grounds</u>, however 5 minute unloading bays will be available at the Forrest Street school entrance. When you get to school you will put your tent up as a family on the oval

In terms of risk management, we really need kids to sleep and hang out in their own tents and not their mates. Hopefully the campsite will be pushing out zzzz's by 9.30pm Friday evening (you can expect an early wake up from the eager kids come Saturday morning). Please remember that there will be kids as young as three attending and therefore heading to bed earlier than some of the older kids.

The program includes some after-dark activities around the school before bed.

On Saturday morning, a coffee van will be on site from 6am til 8am (for the adults only). Please bring your reusable coffee cup to minimise waste!

A hot breakfast will be provided, with bacon and eggs available from the BBQ's and vegetarian and gluten-free options available from the kitchen. Hot Milo and juice will also be available for the kids. Please bring reusable cups for the kids to minimise waste!

Pack up the tents, and head for home at 9am. Throughout the camp, your kids are your responsibility, so please **do not at any time leave the camp site until the conclusion of the camp at 9am on Saturday.** Please remember, no alcohol.

What to bring:

Dad & Kids

Tent/camping chairs

Dinner food that you can cook on your camp stove – no nuts please!

Plates and utensils, including reusable cups for breakfast

Bedding/blanket

Torches

Clothes, closed in shoes

Water bottles

Snacks for in the tent (including an early morning snack if the kids need food before breakfast is served at 6.30am). No nuts please!

A bag for dirty dishes – much easier to take home to wash-up
